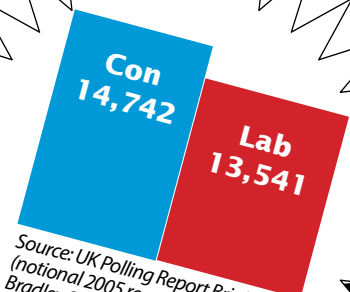

## Sixth Form Success

Your local Conservatives are making good on their promise to provide a new sixth form centre in Bradley Stoke. The latest update is that a planning application has now been submitted and a decision is expected in October, despite attempts by *Liberal Democrat Jon Williams* to oppose it. The £5 million sixth form proposal consists of a purpose built 'green' sixth form centre; dance studio and extension to the changing rooms to expand the school from 900 places for 11 -16 to 1080 places for 11-18. If successful with a bid to the Government for funding, it is anticipated the sixth form will open for pupils in September 2010. Thank you to everyone who signed our petition – it really made the difference!

## CONSERVATIVES CUT COUNCIL TAX RISES

Conservative-run South Gloucestershire Council have announced plans to slash planned rises in council tax after recognising the soaring cost of living that local residents are having to deal with. Large council tax increases had been planned when Labour and the Liberal Democrats helped to run the council, but the Conservatives have pledged to reduce these increases.

Local campaigner Paul Turner has welcomed the council's proposals and says, "We are all struggling with the increasing cost of living. When the Lib Dems were in power they raised Council Tax by a record amount of 12.4%! Conservatives are committed to helping local people and have responded in a way that really matters."
